REBUILDING NEW MCO SCHOOLS.

MCO is calling upon parners, wellwishers and friends to help her rebuilt the institution which has for the past 20 years have cared and supported the spiritual, education of over seventeen thousand children in the slums of Mathare.

The current MCO structures are in dilapidated conditions. The building were done using corrugated iron sheets. Most affected are the school buildings at MCO 4B, MCO Joy and MCO Secondary all situated within the Mathare slums. The classroom spaces are small hence no longer appropriate to accommodate the growing number of students. The school have been home to several poor students in the slums of Mathare. The standard of education has been kept high

The current structures are prone to damage and fire. The need to put permanent buildings cannot be over emphasized.

The schools performance in national examination especially the Kenya Certificate of Primary Education has over the years remained impressive. This has triggered demand for admission . The current status is not only limiting extra admission but the structures are wanting.

We believe with better buildings, it will attract more students and in turn sustain the project activities. One great challenge has been sustaining the program activities. The running of the schools remain highly potential.

We are looking at approximately US \$ 1,000,000 or Ksh 100,000,000 to make this a reality. It forms part of MCO sustainable program. Your support is highly welcome.

DISCIPLESHIP CLASS 2017

Moriah School of Discipleship admitted the year 2017 students for a six month discipleship training. The students joined in the month of January. This is the fifth group to join the school since inception in the year 2013. A total of 21 students comprising 13 girls and 8 boys got admitted in the training.

The school which is located in Maseno, Kisumu County, trains young Christian leaders through and focuses on; Discipleship & it's dynamics Practical Life Skills – Creative arts Basic Bible/Theology courses Leadership Training World Missions & Field Exposure **The objectives are;** Understanding that Jesus gave the Church just one command; to make disciples who can make

ENHANCING ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT **IN MATHARE SLUMS**

On the 28th of FEB 2017 SFL carried out our 3rd Community Agents (CA) training that lasted four days. The event saw the training of 36 CAs successfully completed. The



of the training was to impact both spiritual and

economic empowerment to the community agents who will in turn impact the knowledge to the community members.

The training covered different topics in depth which include; The importance of restoring the four key relationships that were broken during creation (man with: God, man, others and creation) and its connection and relevance to the SFL program, leadership and elections of SFL associations, the use and need of Social funds (microinsurance), Development of group constitution, First savings meeting, First loan meeting and First loan repayment as well as share out and graduation. This was facilitated by the SFL staff and Courtney O' Connell SFL technical advisor. An introduction of SFL was made where the CAs were encouraged to see the program as holistic engagement where it changes the members spiritually, socially, economically and physically. There group activities were done to encourage team work, cooperation, leadership and other team building/personal skills.

These community agents are volunteer local community members who are well known to the community. Their duty is to reach out to the community and assist in the mobilization and formation of savings groups within the community on spiritual empowerment and economic independency. Each CA is expected to form atleast one group per month which will in turn enable us achieve our target of reaching 3000 members from our current 1500 by august

This goes for nine months until the group graduates to a new phase. The CAs are then compensated for the time and energy spent during this process with a small incentive.

The training was successful and we thank God for both financial and spiritual support. We look forward to a new growth in terms of members from this new team of CAs.

RAGEN PROJECT

The Ragen Project is located in Nyakach district, Kisumu county.

The Ragen program forms part of the sustainable projects plans earmarked by the institution. The project sit on a three acre space.

The site is to host a church, prayer center as well as a discipleship school. This is our key focus. We need to construct various buildings to host the church, students dormitory, prayer rooms and hostel. Such a combined facility is lacking in the area. As we pray and look for partners to support us make it a reality, already fish farming has been started after the construction of 4 ponds with a total capacity of 8000 fish. Each pond carries 2000 fingerlings. First harvest is expected form the month of June.

Clean water was drilled in the site and need to bottle water has been mooted. It produces over 10,000 littles of water each day and the water is pumped using solar. The government chemist has certify the water as fit for human consumption. We are looking for interested partners for this highly potential program. Initial cost to purchase bottling machine and incidental costs at approximately Us \$ 6500.



NEW KITCHEN

MCO Joy primary school and MCO 4B School had new kitchen built in each of the school courtesy of Tumaini Afrika group to the tune of ksh 380,000. The old kitchens were in bad shape, smoky, hot, rusty and leaked during rainy season.



staff would sit outside as they cook since the smoke emitted was unendurable. Daraja another team had built eco savings stoves in each of the kitchen again to our delight.

The stoves consumes very little firewood. The floor of the kitchens are well cemented that allows the kitchen staff to easily clean them. The drainage system has also been improved.

The only challenge remaining now is to fit in sinks

and fix running water plus drawers for keeping plates. We are looking for approximately Ksh 120,000 or US & 1200

The kitchen staff now work in comfort. The food is prepared in time to serve one thousand one hundred students each day.

Interesting the new kitchen has attracted even the community members who wants to get in and have a look.

Its only our school Kariobangi primary still with an old, smoky and small kitchen . We are also looking for funds to the tune of US \$ 2,500 to put up a new kitchen.

We highly appreciate both Dajara and Tumaini Afrika for your support. Your support was never in vain. It has brought a huge difference in our institution and the lives of the children we serve in Mathare slums. We hail you as true agents of change.
